# WELCOME TO IRONWOOD

estled amidst the hills of the Western Upper Peninsula, the City of Ironwood offers outstanding educational and business opportunities coupled with a vibrant community life. Ironwood's cultural richness in sport, music, dance, theatre, and the visual arts combines with an unmatched outdoor recreational landscape. From summer biking on the paved Iron Belle trail and area mountain biking trails to winter snowshoe, ski, and snowmobile action, Ironwood has year-round outdoor recreation possibilities that include the Porcupine Mountains, the Ottawa National Forest, Lake Superior, Little Girls Point, Copper Peak, the Miners Memorial Heritage Park, and the Black River Scenic Byway.

Combining this indoor and outdoor activity landscape, Ironwood's unique living environment has much to offer singles, families, entrepreneurs, and retirees. Our historic downtown, with its small shops and restored 1927 theatre, joins together with expanding national and regional stores along Ironwood's U.S. Highway 2 corridor to provide a comprehensive retail environment. In relocating to Ironwood, you will discover that small-town living does not mean giving up accustomed amenities.

Whether taking in the unique deep-blue color of the northern sky and night-time Aurora Borealis or watching and listening to the cascade of water over our many back country waterfalls, hunting for *Yooperlites* on the Lake Superior shore at Little Girls Point, biking the Iron Belle trail as it passes through the forest or ice-fishing on Lake Gogebic, you will find that living is good, in Ironwood!







#### BUILDING COMMUNITY

ronwood civic life is typified by educational opportunity, a health and wellness activity focus, a strong volunteer ethic, and supportive businesses and organizations.

The city of Ironwood's Community Development Department ironwoodmi. gov/community-development working along with the Chamber of Commerce, service clubs, and non-profit organizations, have as their common goal the fostering of a connected and inclusive community: a safe space where vision, talent, and energy can thrive. Major community festivals, such as July's Festival Ironwood, August's Emberlight Festival, and December's Jack Frost Festival are augmented by a host of other community happenings that occur throughout the year. Examples are Downtown Ironwood's monthly First Friday, and the Gogebic Range Farmer's Market, where local skills and talents are showcased.

Ironwood has a strong civic participation spirit, where dozens of organizations covering, health, sport, recreation, theatre, and the arts utilize volunteers to grow their missions and enhance their activities. For folks who choose to relocate to Ironwood, you will find an amazing variety of opportunities for both youth and adults to become involved in every aspect of community life, from outdoor recreation to service and cultural groups. Volunteers maintain the Iron Belle, ski and mountain biking trails. They participate in all sorts of activities at the school, the theatres, the ice rink, the library, the Miner's Park, the City, society, and service clubs. #### HISTORY: THE WAY WE WERE

ronwood's name originates with Mr. James Wood, an early 19th century mineral explorer. Jim's nickname of *Iron* Wood was given to him by fellow explorers on account of his talent for discovering the area's iron ore deposits. When the first town dwellings were built, the settlement name suggested was "Iron-Wood" out of respect for Jim Wood's exploratory efforts.

Immigrants, logging, and iron mining went hand-in-hand, creating a classic early 20th century "boom town." The mines expanded rapidly, with Ironwood reaching a population of 20,000 during the 1920's. It had its own symphony orchestra, theatrical companies, national clubs, and saw the erection of some truly landmark buildings, including the 1927 Ironwood Theatre and the 1923 Memorial Buildingboth of which are today must-sees for visitors. Educationally, the strikingly beautiful 1924 Luther L. Wright school still continues its educational mission, as does Gogebic Community College, founded in 1927.

Today, the mines and their buildings are gone, the old growth forests cut down, and, while the entire railroad infrastructure is gone too, the present-day Iron Belle walking/biking trail sits atop the old C&NW railroad grade, enabling one to follow the old route eastwards over historic bridges to Ramsay, MI. Various kiosks offer historical context, and the forest regrowth gives one a real sense of how *things usta was* in the early 20<sup>th</sup> Century.

Other Ironwood historic sites to visit include the 1902 Carnegie Library and the 1893 C&NW Depot. Stop in at the Depot and pick up a copy of the Ironwood Historical Downtown Walking Tour brochure, which guides you to explanatory plaques on existing structures. wenty-first century Ironwood is active, inclusive, forward-looking, and utilizes its natural and built environments as vital components in the creation of sustainable development. Commercial growth can be seen through such recent openings or expansions of Copper Cup Coffee, The White Rabbit Wine Bar, Downtown Bodega, Lake Effect Books, Don and GG's, Suffolk Street Eatery, Northwind Natural Foods, Contrast Coffee, and Cold Iron Brewing—to name but a few. North Ironwood's U.S. 2 highway corridor offers such recognized brands as Kwik Trip, Shoe Sensation, Marshalls, Ollies, Tractor Supply, and Super One Foods—as well as our recent cannabis dispensary additions: Levels, High Profile, Rize, The Fire Station, and Higher Love.

The Gogebic-Iron Airport offers
Denver Air daily flights to Chicago and
Minneapolis, allowing excellent business/
visitor connections to these major hubs.
Other important amenities not often
found in a town of Ironwood's size include
Gogebic Community College and the
recently-enlarged Aspirus Ironwood
Hospital.

#### A SENSE OF TRANQUILITY

he Ironwood region is one of unparalleled beauty throughout the four seasons—each of which has its own special magic. For those who live here it is a homeland that truly enters into the soul. For visitors, the forests, waterfalls, Lake Superior beaches, hiking/biking trails and yes, the snow and northern lights all work together to create a felt space that is calming and restorative to the mind. The phrase *find your north* accurately describes the Upper Peninsula experience: a landscape that centers thoughts and reestablishes connections.

The waterfalls along the Black River Scenic Byway, just north of Ironwood, offer the sound and sight of rushing water over rocks within a forest setting. Venturing a few miles north of the falls brings you to Lake Superior's Black River Harbor, home to wide beaches on the Lake Superior shore that offer excellent agate and *Yooperlite* hunting, as well as the ideal spot to just put down a blanket and watch and listen to the waves lap up on the beach, as they have done for thousands of years. Both Black River Harbor and Little Girls Point offer calming respites for young and old alike.

Ironwood is *Mile 0* of Michigan's Iron Belle Trail, a 10-mile paved hiking/biking trail that offers amazing landscape vistas through forests and over historic railroad bridges to the famed Keystone Bridge in Ramsay, MI. Especially in fall, a bike/walking trip on the Iron Belle takes you into a natural world bursting with color. Along the way you will find kiosks that display historic photographs and narrate the logging and mining story of the Iron Range.

# LEARNING & GROWING

hether just visiting Ironwood or relocating here, there are many learning experience opportunities. Formal education foundations from Luther L. Wright K-12 school and Gogebic Community College are supplemented by a diverse array of youth and adult organizations for which experiencing new things is key. The 906 Adventure Team introduces youngsters to both the physical aspects of biking and the social aspects of working together in a team setting. Likewise, Gogebic County 4-H (head, heart, hands, and health) brings mentoring adults and youth together to develop real world skills and participate in community service.

The Ironwood area has an amazing number of youth and family directed organizations in addition to 4-H: the SISU Dirt Crew, Theatre North, Polar Bear Hockey, Ice Crystals Figure Skating Club, Awkward Stage Drama Club, Gogebic Range Band, JROTC, the Downtown Art Place, Chamber Singers, and Team Z Ski Team—all offer year-round activities for kids, youth, and adults. Retiring here? Check out Fe University feuniversity:org.it's designed for adults aged 50+ but open to all for whom life-long learning is a personal passion.

Vacationing in Ironwood?
Ironwood's Miners Memorial Heritage Park offers great opportunity to learn about our mining and logging past. On those occasional rainy days, you can visit the Ironwood Memorial Building or Hurley, Wisconsin's Iron County Historical Museum, whose thematic displays cover Western U.P. life as well. The Erwin Township, Wakefield, Bessemer, and Ironwood museums all have great artifact and narrative displays about regional history as well.

#### THE ACTIVE LIFE

isiting, vacationing, and living in Ironwood's Western Upper Peninsula area allows both individuals and families to give full reign to their active and energetic natures. Surrounding you on all sides and in all seasons lies both a natural and built landscape that calls out for adventure.

Hikers are provided with a varied array of trail types and environments. For the hiker who likes a paved surface, the Iron Belle Trail is perfect. Stretching ten miles from Ironwood to Ramsay, this asphalt-paved trail takes one out into the forest and over historic railroad bridges-it is an amazing experience in full fall color. For the more intrepid hikers, the Miners Park and Copper Peak trails provide groomed surfaces and more integral nature encounters. For the dedicated hiker, the North Country Trail provides the ultimate historic forest voyageur experience.

Snow sport enthusiasts know that *Big Snow Country* is the place to be in wintertime. Area ski resorts offer outstanding downhill skiing, while Wolverine Nordic wolverinenordic.com and ABR Trails feature miles and miles of groomed cross-country ski and snowshoe trails. Right inside Ironwood is the Miners Park, a crosscountry ski, snowshoeing and fat tire biking haven.

Thinking of relocating to the Ironwood area? This is the *recreation* destination. Outdoor erwinheritage.org and indoor pickleball courts are here. Youth soccer, hockey, wrestling, and figure skating clubs, and a summer full of festival action activities, from Gus Macker basketball macker.com/local/wakefield-mi to the famous Paavo Nurmi marathon thepaavonurmimarathon.com makes U.P. action fun for all ages.



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#### TOGETHER WITH TALENT

hile out-of-doors
Ironwood has skiing,
hiking, biking, rockcollecting, and
fishing, INSIDE Ironwood has a 120+ year
performing arts history of music, theatre,
and dance. With two performing arts
theaters, community choir and band, youth
and adult community drama organizations,
as well as numerous individual performers
and popular music bands, Ironwood is the
Western Upper Peninsula's center for the
performing arts—for locals, visitors, and
relocators.

Founded in 1964, Theatre North theatrenorth.org is among the three oldest continuously operating community theatres in the United States. It produces 3-4 major plays each year on its home Theatre North stage. The 2024-2025 season included Plaid Tidings, Clue, and Proof. Previous productions run the gamut of such musicals as The Sound of Music, and Oliver! to plays like A Streetcar Named Desire and Second Samuel. Youth and children's theatre is also a vital part of the Ironwood drama tradition, with the lively stage-struck kids of the Awkward Stage Drama Group bringing performance experience—both acting and stagecraft—to middle and high school students.

Encompassing music, art, craft, and film, Ironwood's Emberlight Festival *emberlight.org* brings performing artists from across the nation to Ironwood during July and August. Founded by Metropolitan Opera Star and Bessemer, MI native, Miles Mykkanen, Emberlight is a complete performing arts showcase whose offerings attract visitors from all over the United States: and international film festival, photography exhibits, concerts, craft/historic performance events, and Art in the Miners Park all make July and August in Ironwood the artistic place to be!

#### A LOOK AT ART

or the visual artist, Western Upper Peninsula visiting and living presents outdoor vistas of amazing scope, from white-water streams and waterfalls to the fall explosion of leaf color across miles of unbroken forest. While centered at Ironwood's Downtown Art Place Gallery and Studios, many artists have country studios as well. The Range Art Association's Studio Tour on the first weekend in August brings artists and art lovers from far and wide to see artists in their studios and view special exhibits range art.org. For over 70 years, the Range Art Association has held an annual Art Show and Market the third week of August in the historic Ironwood Memorial Building Auditorium, a 100 year old building whose unique stained glass windows and wall murals showcase a visual link to Ironwood's historic art community.

The Emberlight Festival moves art to nature outside with the annual Art in the Miner's Memorial Heritage Park presentations (July through September) where art compositions integrated with the natural landscape become central thematic elements of many Miners Park trails.

Both public and private Ironwood area entities feature art classes, work spaces, and year-round events for folks of all ages. The Carnegie Library; Downtown Art Place; Birch, Please Crafting Studio; Saint Maud's Public Workshop; Ann Marie Batiste, LLC; and other studios and educational organizations feature art learning opportunities for everyone.

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
#### **ADVENTURE** ON THE EDGE

he Western U.P. welcomes people from all over the United States as well as from abroad. While many come to quietly observe and absorb our 4-season landscape vistas, others come to connect with the land and water through swimming in Lake Superior, white water river kayaking, ice fishing, and journeying into the forests on the North Country Trail. Much of the U.P. is remote and free from 21st century tech links (including cell phones), so for those who seek the direct nature adventure encounter, the U.P. is the place to be!

Black River National Forest Scenic Byway (Black River Road) lies just north of Ironwood, and has five awesome waterfalls. There are paved trails from the road side parking areas, with Potawatomi Falls observation landing being barrier-free. At road's end is Black River Harbor, which features a campground, picnic areas, a boat landing, and extensive beach areas. This is the place to see and be with the great Lake Superior.

Ironwood's Miners Memorial Heritage Park fmmhp.com encompasses many of the former iron ore mining locations within the City of Ironwood. Interpretive signs and works of art tell the story of this historic landscape as you walk or bike the extensive non-motorized trail network. Over ten miles of newly crafted mountain biking trails within the park offer outstanding recreation for both novice and experienced riders.

Michigan's Iron Belle Trail begins in Ironwood and follows a ten mile paved trail to the town of Ramsay: a path that offers amazing landscape vistas through forests, over former railroad bridges, and endscurrently—at the Keystone Bridge park in Ramsay, MI. Park your car at Ironwood's Depot Park and begin your hiking and biking adventure on the Iron Belle Trail.

he Black River National Forest Scenic Byway (Black River Road) lies just north of Ironwood, and features five beautiful waterfalls. There are paved trails from the roadside parking areas, with the Potawatomi Falls observation platform being barrier-free. At road's end is Black River Harbor on Lake Superior, with a campground, picnic areas, boat landing, and extensive beach areas—the perfect place to see and enter into the Lake Superior experience.

Originating in northern Wisconsin, the Black River flows north, dropping its elevation to meet up with Lake Superior and creating many waterfalls along its path. The Black River gets its name from its unique water color, which is created from tannin (tannic acids) derived from the river's surrounding hemlock trees. Watching the river as it cascades over the rocks, or walking across the historic CCC constructed suspension bridge which crosses the river at the Harbor, are two easy ways to see this unique water coloration.

Traveling north along the Byway, one also meets Copper Peak, the largest ski jump in the Western Hemisphere. Built in 1969, Copper Peak hosted ski jumping and ski flying events until 1994. Currently, Copper Peak is under major renovation with the goal of returning ski jumping to Ironwood. Attracting thousands of visitors every year, Copper Peak's Adventure Ride gives brave souls a chairlift ride to the top of the hill and elevator ride to the main observation deck, with further steps to the top of the jump which presents the viewer with a truly awesome landscape—a vista that encompasses over 2,500 square miles! No trip to Ironwood is complete without a visit to Copper Peak.

In addition to viewing the Falls and enjoying the Lake Superior beach front, other Byway adventures await! Copper Peak is home to a developing series of mountain biking trails, and these are featured at the annual *Copper Peak Trails Fest*. If you prefer hiking to biking, our local Ni-Miikanaake (*I make a trail* in Ojibwa) *North Country Trail Chapter* works to maintain the Byway portion of the NCT trail, which has a trail head at Black River Harbor. The distinctive blue paint markers on selected trail trees help guide you through this section of the Ottawa National Forest. There is no better way to experience the wonder these deep forests engender, than a hike on the North Country Trail.





#### FARTHER AFIELD: BESSEMER, WAKEFIELD & LAKE GOGEBIC

ake Gogebic is the largest (13,380 acres of water) natural inland lake in the Upper Peninsula and is located within the Ottawa National Forest, sharing parts of two counties (Gogebic and Ontonagon) as well as two time zones (Eastern and Central). It is a true fisherman's paradise, with walleye, pike, bass, perch, and whitefish.

Bessemer, MI lies a few miles east of Ironwood and is the official Gogebic County seat. Hosting two of our largest regional festivals every year, the Bessemer Blast 4th of July week bessemer4th.com and the September Pumpkinfest, Bessemer also marks the southern entry to the Black River Road Scenic Byway.


A few more miles east takes you to Wakefield, home of Sunday Lake, and the grandest, most spectacular 4th of July fireworks display in the entire U.P. Sunday Lake offers excellent lakeside camping, and is also home to June IWA Watercross racing—an amazing event to see!

ronwood area spring and summer time brings the melting of the winter white and the rebirth of our landscape with warmth and amazingly diverse plant colors. Awe inspiring Lake Superior shoreline beaches, forest waterfalls under the uniquely blue U.P. skies, and a wealth of hiking, biking, ORV/ATV riding, camping, and fishing experiences await the visitor.

Ironwood's Gogebic County is home to a large chunk of the millionacre Ottawa National Forest. Check out the Ottawa's website for Black River Harbor campground registrations: fs. usda. gov/ottawa Thinking of coming up this summer to find your north? You can gather information about our county and state parks, as well as register for a campsite by visiting the Gogebic County website gogebic.gov

Are you traveling to the Ironwood area during the season? Here are some tips! While the month of April is usually referred to as mud month, depending upon temperatures and snow cover, mid-April can bring the most spectacular waterfall flow of the year. A good general guide to locations and access is: uptravel.com/outdoors-recreation/waterfalls. Waterfalls are normally easier to access in May, but rates of flow may vary, depending upon rain and snow melt. Still, April and May remain the most exciting waterfall flowage months.

The season (for locals as well as visitors) really begins on Memorial Day and rapidly advances to Labor Day. Summer displays the full green of forest and the warmth of Lake Superior beaches. It is the ideal time for hiking, biking, camping, fishing, and ATV/ORV riding. For the latter, here is a link to licenses, maps, and information: explorewesternup.com/outdoorrecreation/orvs-atvs

eing so close to Lake
Superior allows Ironwood
to offer a magically unique
fall and winter natural
landscape. Nature creates a wonderland
in our area forests, with vivid autumn
colors followed by a deep and clarifying
winter white. As one of the top five places
in the United States to experience fall
color, the Ironwood area is the place to be
in the U.P.

A good tip for all U.P. fall leaf hunters is to make use of the vast number of U.P. webcams to check out how fall leaf color is advancing. The Ironwood Chamber website has eight webcams, displaying views from Saxon Harbor and Mt. Zion, to Ironwood's Depot Park and Wakefield's Snowriver Resort: ironwoodchamber.org/webcam. For up to date general fall U.P. color forecasts—and Northern Lights information—go to funintheup.com.

Known as Big Snow Country, the Western Upper Peninsula is home to several major ski hill resorts where excellent downhill skiing can be found. Cross country ski and snowshoe trails continue their expansion and development, and the SISU Ski Fest sisuskifest.com and Yooperbeiner wolverinenordic.com events are highlights of organized winter fun activities.

Two major Ironwood area downhill ski resorts are Big Powderhorn, just north of Bessemer bigpowderhorn. net and Snowriver Resort, which is north of Wakefield snowriver.com. Both resorts offer great downhill action, plus food and lodging. Right within the city limits of Ironwood is the Miner's Memorial Heritage Park, which features miles of groomed snowshoe and cross-country ski trails fmmhp.com. Check out their website and Facebook page for trail maps and conditions.





#### **IRONWOOD**









hether you are a tourist, visitor, or someone looking to relocate to the Ironwood area, gathering information about *U.P. Life* is easy to do. The Wakefield Visitor Center, located at the junction of U.S. 2 and Michigan Highway 28 (right next to Sunday Lake) provides in-person counter service from Memorial Day to the middle of October. The Ironwood Chamber of Commerce Historic Ironwood Depot office (150 North Lowell Street) is open M-F from 8ish to 2ish, and has a good selection of state and regional maps.
